An Accessible City: proposed changes on St Asaph Street

Christchurch City Council is inviting feedback on proposed changes to the Central City travel network. These transport projects are needed to support the recovery of the Central City, including anchor projects.

The proposed changes, outlined in the Christchurch Central Recovery Plan's transport chapter *An Accessible City*, are on St Asaph Street (from Ferry Road to Antigua Street). One of the key features is a separated cycleway on the south side of the street.

Consultation on concept designs starts on Thursday 17 September and closes on Thursday 8 October 2015.

The enclosed booklet provides more detailed information on the proposed changes. If you would like to provide feedback a response form is included in the booklet.

The Council will hold a number of community drop-in sessions where you can find out more about the project, talk to staff and provide your comments.

You are invited to attend a presentation by the project team at the start of both drop-in sessions at the BNZ Lounge, EPIC, 96 Manchester Street.
