6. REGIONAL COMMITTEE UPDATE

7. DRAFT WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT STRATEGY 2012

The Committee received a presentation from Diane Shelander, Christchurch City Council on the Draft Wastewater Management Strategy in the context of alignment and synergy with the Canterbury Water Management Strategy (CWMS) (refer **attached**).

The Committee asked staff to clarify the footnote on page 11 of the Draft Strategy, which notes there was an intention to develop an 'appropriate legal status' to the ZIPs.

The Committee agreed not to make a submission on the Draft Wastewater Management Strategy 2012 at this time, due to the Committee's ongoing work in developing its ZIP.

8. PROPOSED LAND AND WATER REGIONAL PLAN - CHRISTCHURCH WEST MELTON ZONE UPDATE

The Committee received a briefing from Alastair Picken, Environment Canterbury, on the Proposed Land and Water Regional Plan and the development of Selwyn-Waihora sub regional chapter relevant to Christchurch - West Melton Zone.

The Committee noted its concern regarding drinking water quality, in terms of water being received within the Christchurch - West Melton Zone, from other zones. The Committee noted the potential implications of the action taken in other zones for the Committee in achieving its priority outcomes within developing its own draft ZIP.

The Committee asked Environment Canterbury to investigate how the Christchurch - West Melton Zone Committee will be involved in the further development of the process and the most appropriate way for the Committee to be engaged as the sub-regional chapter develops.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this agenda item is for the Regional Committee to be updated on the regulatory and non-regulatory approaches that are currently being developed to help implement the CWMS in Selwyn-Waihora Zone.

The agenda item is for information. No decision is required.

BACKGROUND

Selwyn-Waihora Zone Implementation Programme was finalised in December 2011. The Zone Committee is currently involved in the development of both regulatory and non-regulatory approaches to the implementation of the CWMS in the Selwyn-Waihora Zone:

- A sub-regional chapter of the Proposed Land and Water Regional Plan
- An addendum to the Selwyn-Waihora Zone Implementation Programme

These approaches are being developed in conjunction, for implementation as a package. The nutrient limit setting process is already well advanced and includes a number of focus groups with significant time input from the zone committee and wider community. Many other topics of discussion are also on-going. The Zone Committee anticipates it will be in a position to share its preferred integrated approach for the zone with the Regional Committee in February 2012.

The Regional Implementation Programme (RIP) recognises the importance of local catchment/zone decision making/involvement in water management, in particular with reference to the setting of nutrient limits at a catchment level in relation to land use and water quality, and for ensuring that individual water storage and distribution proposals help to deliver Zone Implementation Programmes. The Regional Committee and RIP provide a wider, regional perspective on implementation of the Canterbury Water Management Strategy (CWMS) in conjunction with the more local perspective of Zone Committees and Zone Implementation Programmes (ZIPs).

The Regional Committee agreed in October 2012 that it would have a "light touch" to its involvement in the development of sub-regional chapters of the Proposed Land and Water Plan. The CWMS Team have planned two main points of engagement between the Regional Committee and Selwyn-Waihora Zone Committee in relation to the development of the package:

- Regional Committee public meeting, November 2012 – Written update
 - A written update from the Zone Committee to the Regional Committee
 - Sharing key points of discussion and learning to date
- Regional Committee public meeting, February 2012 – Zone Committee Presentation and joint Regional / Zone discussion session

- A presentation from the Zone Committee to share their preferred integrated approach for zone
- A joint discussion session for Regional Committee members to highlight any synergies between implementation at the zone and regional level, and to explore any in-consistencies with a view to seeking consensus between CWMS committees
- Identification of further engagement if necessary

Update Report on Selwyn-Waihora Zone

Overview

This update report highlights key points of discussion and learning to date from the Selwyn-Waihora Zone Committee's work developing a sub-regional chapter of the Proposed Land and Water Regional Plan and a Zone Implementation Programme [ZIP] addendum.

Key points related to process:

- Commissioners will be presented with a regulatory and non-regulatory package for implementing the CWMS in the Selwyn-Waihora Zone:
 - The regulatory component is the sub-regional chapter of the Proposed Land and Water Regional Plan
 - The non-regulatory component is a ZIP addendum with recommendations additional to those in the December 2011 ZIP
- The Zone Committee will produce a draft package in February 2013 for discussion with the Te Waihora Co-governance Group, with a view to a final version being presented to the Commissioners at the end of March 2013
- The sub-regional chapter process has been focussed on water quality and quantity limits and allocation methodology, as these will lead to rules in the Plan.
- The Kaitiakitanga, recreational and biodiversity processes have led more clearly to recommendations in the ZIP addendum
- Access to commercial, confidential information has been an impediment to the ZC's discussion on the potential role of new storage as part of an integrated approach for the zone. This has impeded delivery of a complete solution via regulatory and non-regulatory approaches
- Different timeframes for provision of social, cultural, economic and environmental information [e.g. economics information, and cultural impacts information not fully available until Jan 2013] has hindered the Zone Committee's ability to have balanced and fully-informed discussions of all CWMS Priorities, Principles and Targets
- The timetable for completing the process has required significant effort from the Zone Committee, Focus Groups, and support staff, with recognition as the process has progressed that timeframes needed to be, and have been, extended

- There is a specific public relations challenge for successful implementation of the CWMS in the Selwyn-Waihora Zone, as media coverage has inferred that the Strategy is only about increasing irrigated land area
- The Zone Committee believes that many people in rural communities are well-engaged and brought-in to the process, and that this highlights the need for a more proactive and co-ordinated approach to communication to the urban general public by Zone Committees and the Regional Committee, including through Environment Canterbury

Key points related to content of discussions

- Nitrate concentrations in groundwater will remain high [some above half the Maximum Acceptable Value], even with advanced mitigation, as a consequence of nitrate that is already “in the post” from previous land use
- Even advanced on-farm mitigation will not be enough to decrease nitrate [and other nutrients] in some parts of the system to acceptable levels. That will necessitate management at source, along the pathway to, and in the receiving environment
- Some scenarios have been considered that can effect a significant reduction in nitrate levels but they require dramatic land use changes. These have significant social and economic impacts; the Zone Committee and the Focus Groups have major concerns about whether these consequences are acceptable
- The legacy phosphorus in the lake-bed sediments needs a management intervention to improve water quality in Te Waihora Lake Ellesmere
- Replacing groundwater with surface water in the CPW Scheme will help increase flows in lowland streams but the Scheme needs new storage to fully realise this outcome
- There is strong support for audited farm environmental plans as a mechanism to change on-farm water and nutrient management practices, improve environmental understanding, and improve cultural awareness
- Wetlands are a key environmental issue; conservation, rehabilitation and replacement are priorities
- Riparian setbacks and plantings need incentives
- Policies identifying desirable characteristics [what, where, when] for storage schemes in the zone have been developed based on the ZIP
- It is important to recognise that most discussions on water quality and quantity limits have been based on computer modelling.

PURPOSE

BACKGROUND

There are four CWMS committees that are considering the implementation of the CWMS in relation to the Waimakariri catchment, these are:

- Christchurch West Melton Zone Committee
- Regional Committee
- Selwyn-Waihora Committee
- Waimakariri Committee.

The Regional Committee has a whole catchment remit, but from a regional perspective. The Zone Committees have a more detailed remit but only for specific sections of the catchment. A collaborative working process between CWMS committees is being taken to facilitate an integrated approach to implementing the CWMS in the Waimakariri catchment.

A joint meeting was held on 14 September 2012 and a report is attached for this Committee to consider.

The objective of forming the Waimakariri River joint working group is to:

- to share a common understanding of the river,
- to share aspirations and recommendations for the Waimakariri River under the CWMS,
- to ensure that the river is addressed under the principles of Ki Uta Ki Tai (from the mountains to the sea),

- to build relationships between the committees which border the river

Committee perspective

The Committees presented the priorities and recommendations from their implementation programmes that related to the river. This developed a picture of the values and some practical application of them for the on-going management of the Waimakariri. The working group and other attendees then identified the 'gaps' between the implementation programmes as potential areas for the working group to address to ensure that there is a whole catchment management approach to the Waimakariri River.

Outcomes, process and outputs

The working group agreed on the outcomes, process and outputs for the meetings. The key points from this were:

Outcomes

- To identify and agree a joint package of recommendations for inclusion in relevant ZIPs and RIP to implement the CWMS in the catchment
- ZIPs/RIPs are used by decision makers in combination to inform the management of whole catchment and implementation of the CWMS
- To establish and/or further develop working relationships between CWMS committees with a shared interest in the Waimakariri River catchment
- To inform ways of working between CWMS committee on other cross-zone catchments

Process

- Establish a Joint Waimakariri River Working Group hosted by the Regional Committee involving the 4 CWMS Committees
 - Christchurch West-Melton Zone, Regional Committee, Selwyn-Waihora Zone, Waimakariri Zone
 - Up to a maximum of 3 representatives per committee on the working group
- Delegates take direction from ZCs/RC but work collaboratively as a team to develop a whole catchment approach by consensus

Outputs

- Output from working group is a 1 to 2 page report to Zone Committees and Regional Committee for endorsement, including:
 - A high level statement of shared values and outcomes for the catchment to be included in each ZIP/RIP
 - New recommendations or changed recommendations for inclusion in each ZIP/RIP (presumption that existing Waimakariri recommendations in ZIPs/RIPs are maintained)
- Each ZIP includes annex that identifies Waimakariri River related recommendations for the zone
- RIP includes CWMS overview of process of addressing cross-boundary catchments

- RIP includes annex that identifies Waimakariri related recommendations from regional perspective
- RIP annex also includes nested links/content for zone specific recommendations (single reference point for catchment)
