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1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report requests that the buildings specified in **Attachment 1** be exempted from the Council's current policy on the closure of earthquake-prone buildings and that notice be placed at the entrance and exits of each facility as to their status.

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2.1 The Facilities Rebuild Team (FRT) has undertaken Detailed Engineering Evaluations (DEE's) on the Greenspace building portfolio. The majority of DEE assessments have now been finalised. This has resulted in a list of assets identified as being below 34% NBS the threshold which the Council has agreed to as a requirement for buildings to remain open.
 - 2.1.1 Staff have identified buildings that Council could consider exempting from the current closure policy on the basis that they are not considered dangerous to occupy, (i.e., no critical structural weaknesses / no brittle collapse risk / minimal earthquake damage).
 - 2.1.2 The buildings generally include toilet blocks, pavilions, barns and garages. Many are occasional / low use facilities.
 - 2.1.3 Further reviews of the buildings have been undertaken to interpret the engineers findings and to assess whether it may be possible to keep buildings open on a short term basis until a more permanent strengthening or replacement solution is identified.
 - 2.1.4 The team is obtaining concept drawings and cost estimates for strengthening to a target of 67% of the Building Code, as per the Council's earthquake-prone building policy.
 - 2.1.5 A report is currently being drafted which will recommend solutions to repair, strengthen or rebuild Greenspace assets. This will be brought to the Council early in the New Year. A set of criteria is being established to prioritise and guide appropriate remedial work on individual assets.
 - 2.1.6 The list of buildings which Greenspace and Facilities Rebuild Teams are seeking to have exempted from the Earthquake-prone Building Policy is included in **Attachment 1**.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 A report was provided to the Council at the 6 December 2012 Council meeting, which sought to change the Council's Occupancy Approach. After consideration and debate, the Council chose not to make the change to the occupancy of our non-housing buildings as recommended at that time.
- 3.2 As a result of a Notice of Motion presented at the 28 February 2013 Council meeting, a change was effected to the occupancy of our social housing buildings which lowered the threshold to 17% New Building Standard (NBS) if a building had not sustained significant damage and did not contain a brittle collapse risk.
- 3.3 Both of these two changes (the former change was proposed but lost and the latter change was passed) effectively lowered the threshold for occupancy of Council-owned buildings.
- 3.4 Further to that, the Council requested information on other buildings that might be able to be opened but that did not meet the 34% NBS threshold. To that end, at a meeting on 27 June 2013, the Council exempted the following buildings from closure on the basis that they had not sustained significant damage and did not contain a brittle collapse risk:
 - (i) Duvauchelle Hall
 - (ii) Okains Bay Community Hall
 - (iii) Harewood Community Hall
 - (iv) Risingholme Workshop Building
 - (v) Little Akaloa Community Hall
 - (vi) Pigeon Bay Community Hall

4. COMMENT

4.1 It should be noted that if a decision is made to exempt the buildings in **Attachment 1** from closure, then, service checks and health and safety checks will be undertaken to ensure the buildings are fit for continued use.

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 If these facilities were to close, the provision of less satisfactory temporary solutions (porta loos / containers) would be a cost to the Council. Exemption from closure avoids this cost.
- 5.2 A small cost will be incurred to prepare and erect signage on these facilities but the cost is expected to be minimal from within approved budgets.

6. STAFF RECOMMENDATION

6.1 It is recommended that the Council exempt the buildings specified in **Attachment 1** from the Council's current policy on the closure of earthquake-prone buildings and that notice is placed at the entrance and exits of each facility as to their status.
