PERMITTED TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION

**Under Clause 7(3)(a) of the Canterbury Earthquake
(Resource Management Act Permitted Activities) Order 2011**

Despite anything to the contrary in the Christchurch City, the activities listed below are permitted activities in the specified locations if they comply with the prescribed standards:

- 1. ACTIVITY:** Establish and operate a temporary High Performance Sport NZ training facility
- LOCATION:** Jellie Park, 140 Greers Road
- APPLICANT:** Mike Hyslop, Apollo Projects
- REFERENCE NO:** RMA92020675
- STANDARDS:**

1. The activity must proceed in general accordance with the information submitted to Council on 23 August 2012.
2. No more than 20 full time equivalent persons are allowed to operate from the High Performance site at any one time.
3. With the exception of FTE numbers, the activity must comply with the relevant Standards for Permitted Temporary Accommodation and Temporary Depots and Storage Facilities under Clause 7(3)(a) of the Canterbury Earthquake (Resource Management Act Permitted Activities) Order 2011, contained in the public notice issued by the Council on 9 April 2011.

The Standards for Permitted Temporary Accommodation and Temporary Depots and Storage Facilities contained in the public notice issued by the Council on 9 April 2011 can be viewed on the Temporary Accommodation page of the Council's website (www.ccc.govt.nz/homeliving/buildingplanning/resourceconsents/temporaryaccommodpermitted.aspx).

The above activities are permitted in the specified locations until the expiry of the Canterbury Earthquake (Resource Management Act Permitted Activities) Order 2011. The expiry date is 18 April 2016.

Any temporary activity established under these provisions shall not create or give rise to any existing use right in respect of any land, activity, or structure (refer clause 5/3 Canterbury Earthquake (Resource Management Act Permitted Activities) Order 2011).
