

## PERMITTED TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION AND PERMITTED TEMPORARY DEPOTS AND STORAGE **FACILITIES**

r Clause 7(3)(a) and Clause 8(3)(a) of the Canterbury Earthquake (Resource Management Act Permitted Activities) Order 2011

Despite anything to the contrary in the Christchurch City Plan, the activities listed below are permitted activities in the specified locations if they comply with the prescribed standards:

1. ACTIVITY: Temporary depot LOCATION: 80 Walters Road, Marshland

APPLICANT: MacDonald Gray 2011 Limited

STANDARDS:

- The activity must proceed in general accordance with the information submitted to the Council on 12 December 2013 and further information received on 10 March, 14 April and 22 April 2014.
- The depot is to be operated in accordance with the plan submitted on 22 April 2014 and shall not extend into the adjoining rural land.
- Any storage or containers are to be set back 6 metres from the Walters Road boundary. 3.
- 4. Stored soil and aggregate shall not exceed 2 metres in height above ground level. The hours of operation of the depot shall be limited to 7am to 5pm Monday to Saturday.
- The operator shall ensure that appropriate dust mitigation measures are employed,
- such as water carts or sprinklers The vehicle access to the site shall be formed and finished in clean aggregate for a
- distance of 10 metres from the sealed Walters Road carriageway. Walters Road shall be kept clean and cleared of any mud or shingle. The activity must not create any significant adverse effects (relating, but not limited to, noise, dust, mud, light spill, odour, traffic generation and visual amenity) that 8.
- will, in the opinion of a Council Enforcement or Health Officer, cause nuis occupiers of surrounding sites. If any significant adverse effects do arise, then the Council can impose additional requirements or conditions to avoid, remedy or effects do arise, then mitigate those adverse effects.
- The activity must cease on or before 18 April 2016.
- 10. Upon cessation of the temporary use the site must be returned to rural use and grassed and left clean and tidy.

STANDARDS:

- The activity must proceed in general accordance with the information submitted to e Council on 21 May 2014.
- The activity must not create any significant adverse effects (relating, but not limited to, noise, dust, mud, light spill, odour, traffic generation and visual amenity) that will, in the opinion of a Council Enforcement or Health Officer, cause nuisance for occupiers of surrounding sites. If any significant adverse effects do arise, then the Council can impose additional requirements or conditions to avoid, remedy or mitigate those adverse effects.
- The hours of operation on site will be 7am to 7pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 7pm on Saturdays with half days only possible on Sundays should workloads require.
- The activity must cease on or before 18 April 2016.

Upon cessation of the temporary use the site must be grassed and left clean and tidy.

Any temporary activity established under these provisions shall not create or give rise to any existing use right in respect of any land, activity, or structure (refer clause 5(3) of the Canterbury Earthquake (Resource Management Act Permitted Activities) Order 2011).
